## Farragut Museum presents "Honoring Our Veterans"

On Monday, July 2, the Farragut Museum will unveil a very special exhibit that will showcase paintings by local artist Alexander Dumas—now a collection owned by the Museum. Visitors can also view artifacts from various branches of the military and numerous wars. This exhibit will be on display through early January 2019. A Museum Friends-only exhibit preview is 4:30 - 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 28.

Dumas was born in Detroit, Mich., and started painting on his 27th birthday. Serving in the U.S. Navy from 1945-1949 and as a Hospital Corpsman at the University of Virginia from 1949-1953 gave Alex a unique perspective on war. As a WWII veteran, Alex has carried the images of young men suffering from the wounds of war throughout his life. While he did not see combat, many of his patients came back to the States with wounds that would

The Town of Farragut will host the 31st annual Independence Day Parade at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, July 4. The parade begins on Kingston Pike at Stadium Drive and continues to Boring Road, just east of Farragut Towne Square Shopping Center (old Ingles store site).

This year, one representative from each of the military branches will serve together as grand marshal. The Town will also honor veterans and active military members by inviting them to walk behind the grand marshal boat. If you are interested in walking, please arrive no later than 8:30 a.m. and see a Town staff member to be directed to the appropriate area. No pre-registration is required for walkers.

Fleet Feet Sports Knoxville will host the third annual Farragut Freedom Run 1 Mile & 2 Mile prior to the start of the parade. This flat and fast course is USATF certified and perfect for all levels. This year's race will benefit Smoky Mountain Service Dogs. ## Get to know the Town through the Introduction to Farragut program

Applications are currently being accepted for the 2018 Introduction to Farragut program. This unique series of classes connects participants with the Town by providing information on its history, government structure and operations, public safety, education, and volunteer opportunities.

The program begins with a reception and program kickoff at Farragut Town Hall on Wednesday, Aug. 15, at 6 p.m. Classes are 6-8 p.m. at Town Hall on the following Wednesdays: Aug. 29, Sept. 12, Oct. 3, Oct. 17 and November 7.

Program requirements include attending the Aug. 15 reception, at least four of the five classes, one Board of Mayor and Aldermen meeting (second and fourth Thursdays of each month), one Municipal Planning Commission meeting (third Thursday of each month) and participating in a class project by completing volunteer hours with a nonprofit of the Town's choosing. Farragut residency is not a requirement.

Class participants will have the opportunity to participate in an optional tour of the Town with the Town Administrator on the afternoon of October 10.

Up to 20 participants will be selected; accepted applicants will be notified within seven to 10 days of the application deadline, which is 4 p.m. Friday, July 20. Farragut municipal elections will be held in conjunction with the Knox County general election and the State of Tennessee primary election on Thursday, Aug. 2. The offices of mayor and one alderman from each of Farragut's wards will be filled this year. Ward I is comprised of residents north of Kingston Pike and Ward II is comprised of residents south of Kingston Pike.

Early voting will be held at Farragut Town Hall from Friday, July 13, through Saturday, July 28. Hours were not finalized at press time.

be considered horrific under any circumstance. His wartime paintings are based on combat photographs.

Dumas spent 16 years as a member of the Tennessee State Guard, retiring with the rank of Major. His paintings are on exhibit at the Tennessee Theatre, the East Tennessee Historical Society and the USS Tennessee Battleship Museum, among other places. He currently teaches a painting class at Strang Senior Center in Knoxville.

## Independence Day Parade participant information

Please note the following:

- Parade participants should arrive at the parking lot of Farragut High School no later than 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday, July 4. Access to the high school is available from Campbell Station Road and West End Blvd.

- Only parade vehicles will be allowed to enter the parade line-up area. Older children and adults may be dropped off on the circle surrounding the line-up area, but no vehicles will be permitted to be left unattended in this area. Those participating in the parade or those with small children will need to park in the east parking area. Parade line-up numbers will be available on the Town's website at townoffarragut.org/parade and posted on the Farragut Town Hall front door by 8 a.m. on Friday, June 29. Line-up numbers will not be available by phone.

- Antique car participants: Please plan on arriving at the high school by 8 a.m. in order to avoid the long lines and overheating your car. There is no special entrance or accommodation for antique cars so please allow for an early arrival.

- Large floats: Large floats may be taken to the line-up area at Farragut High School anytime after 5 p.m. on Tuesday, July 3. A guard will be on duty from 5 p.m. until the parade on July 4.

- Giveaways: No candy or giveaways may be thrown from floats or cars. Walkers may distribute these and other free items along the side of the road during the parade. Children younger than age nine must ride (not walk) during the parade.

All parade participants must be picked up at the Farragut Town Square parking lot (old Ingles shopping center).

## Parade to Close Kingston Pike on July 4

Due to the Independence Day Parade, Kingston Pike will be closed from 8:30 a.m. to approximately noon on Wednesday, July 4, from Concord Road to Boring Road. South Campbell Station Road from Kingston Pike to Brooklawn Boulevard and Municipal Center Drive will be closed from 8:30 to 9:15 a.m. for the Farragut Freedom Run.

Detours are: north side - Campbell Station Road to Grigsby Chapel Road to Smith Road to Kingston Pike (going west) or Campbell Station Road to Parkside Drive to Lovell Road (going east) and south side - Concord Road to Turkey Creek Road to Virtue Road to Kingston Pike.

Items left are gathered up every day and stowed in locked storage. More valuable items, like electronics or keys, are stored in the PALS office at Farragut Town Hall.

To inquire about objects left at parks, contact Parks and Athletics Coordinator Lauren Cox at 218-3372. Please keep in mind that some items may have left the park in other hands before our parks assistants had the opportunity to collect them.

With the exception of valuable items, objects collected at parks will be donated after 14 days. Keep enjoying our beautiful parks, but before you leave, scan your surroundings to make sure you've collected all the things, and people, you brought with you.

### Adopt A Bench and Plant A Tree Programs honor loved ones



The Town's Adopt A Bench and Plant A Tree programs are wonderful ways to honor the people, pets and events that make Farragut a beautiful place to live.

The Adopt A Bench program allows community members to choose from a standard park bench for \$500, available for installation at Anchor Park, Mayor Bob Leonard Park or McFee Park, or a cast iron greenway bench for \$1,500, which can be placed along a Town greenway or sidewalk. Every effort will be made to install the bench in a desired location, but some sites are better suited for new benches than others.

Each bench includes a memorial plaque and year-round maintenance. It takes two to three months to order and install benches.

The Plant A Tree program allows community members to remember or honor a loved one by having a tree planted at a Farragut park or along a greenway. Participation includes the purchase and planting of the tree, a plaque set in concrete and a warranty for the tree. Every effort will be made to place the tree along the greenway or in the park of your choice; however, certain species are better suited for certain areas. Please note that the Plant A Tree program is not available for Founders Park at Campbell Station.

### Fun with Fido in Farragut parks

One of the delights of dog ownership is enjoying the great outdoors together. But if you take your pet into a Farragut park, please be respectful of other park users. It's the right thing to do and it's part of the Town's Municipal Code.

To keep our green spaces from going to the dogs, remember to clean up after your pooch. Please pick up pet waste and dispose of it in a sanitary manner. All Farragut parks and greenways have pet stations with pet waste bags and most stations have trash cans. Remember, no dogs are

allowed on athletic fields or on the McFee Park splash pad.

Also keep in mind that pets must be on leashes whenever they are off the property of the owner. If you walk your pup in a park, or on a greenway or sidewalk, it must be on a leash at all times.

Currently, the closest dog park is at Concord Park, a Knox County property located at 10909 Northshore Drive. It offers water fountains for pets, a dock with access to the river and walking trails.
